## **Emergency Organizations**

Amateur Radio operators set up and operate organized communication networks locally for governmental and emergency officials, as well as noncommercial communication for private citizens affected by a disaster. Our club is active in the following organizations:



The Saratoga Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is managed by the City of Saratoga and the Santa Clara County Fire Department.

During an emergency we will staff the Emergency Operation Center (EOC) and assist with communication with volunteers and government agencies.

The purpose of the Silicon Valley Emergency Communications System (SVECS) is to maintain a crew of trained Amateur Radio Operators to provide back-up emergency communications where needed.




The vice

The Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) is coordinated through the American Radio Relay League and its field volunteers to provide free communications during emergences and for planned events.

The Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (RACES) is coordinated through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). It is activated when a government entity requests amateur radio assistance for a disaster or wide-reaching emergency.

Meetings are on the first Wednesday of each month (except July and August) at 7:30 pm. We usually have a



guest speaker and finish around 9 pm.

They are held at the Saratoga Fire Station, located at 14380 Saratoga Avenue on the corner of Saratoga-Sunnyvale and Los Gatos-Saratoga Roads in Saratoga.

Prior to the meeting some of our members enjoy having dinner at Jake's of Saratoga Restaurant located at 12175 Saratoga-Sunnyvale Road (0.1 mile South of Prospect Road). We usually arrive around 6:00 p.m. Someone will be monitoring the repeater while we are at dinner so check-in and say "Hi" if you are on your way.

We strongly suggest you bring your 2M HT in case you have difficulty finding the meeting. If you do, please contact someone on the club repeater.

# Activities

Several time a year, we have a one-day <u>technician license</u> <u>class</u> followed by the license exam. We offer follow-up



classes on how to program your radio

and on proper operating practices and procedures.

Our major annual event is <u>Field Day</u> in June. During a 24-hour period, hams contact as many stations as possible within the U.S. and Canada. It is an excellent opportunity to demonstrate Amateur Radio to local elected community leaders, key individuals with the organizations that Amateur Radio might serve in an emergency, as well as the general public. On **<u>Halloween</u>**, we patrol the Saratoga schools in the evening and report any suspicious activity. One of our members rides with the Sheriff as he patrols the area.

Other times our members are active in assisting with communications in <u>community events</u> such as bicycle races, parades, and other civic activities.
